4th COFERENCE: "DEAFBLINDNESS FROM THE ACADEMIC PERSPECTIVE" WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE LATIN AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN INTERUNIVERSITY NETWORK ON DISABILITY AND HUMAN RIGHTS (REDLAT)
